

**Note: Unaccepted amounts less than 10 tonnes are not automatically rolled to the next Series.**

Following the deadline date for each Series contract program, the quantity of grain offered under contract is compared to sales requirements and transportation capacity. Sales requirements determine the maximum tonnage we can accept under each delivery contract program. The CWB announces an acceptance level for each Series contract program (A, B, C)\* within 18 days of the sign-up deadline. The acceptance level is the producer's guarantee of delivery by the end of the crop year.

Every producer receives the same acceptance percentage on their delivery contracts. For example, if the acceptance is 60 per cent and one producer offers 125 tonnes, the CWB guarantees to call 60 per cent or 65 tonnes by the end of the crop year. If another producer offers 200 tonnes, the CWB guarantees to call 60 per cent, or 120 tonnes, by the end of the crop year.

Contract calls issued during the crop year will total the percentage accepted.

If acceptance is less than 100 per cent, do not amend the contract tonnage. Record the accepted percentage in the [Per cent accepted box](#) on the [CWB delivery contract programs](#) pages in the delivery permit book.

### Automatic rollover

If the acceptance level is less than 100 per cent, we will automatically roll the unaccepted tonnes to the next delivery contract Series in the crop year.

For example, when there is less than 100 per cent acceptance on a Series A contract, the unaccepted portion automatically rolls over to a Series B\* contract. Likewise, unaccepted portions of a Series B\* contract automatically roll over to a Series C\* contract. This automatic rollover saves the producer from having to sign up unaccepted tonnes.

### Cancelling a Series contract with reduced acceptance

If the CWB does not accept 100 per cent of the grain offered, the producer can reduce the contract to zero or the delivered amount within 14 days of the acceptance level announcement. To cancel the contract, the producer must call us with their CWB 10-digit producer ID number and four-digit PIN or contact their local FBR. We will also cancel unaccepted tonnes that rolled to the next contract series.

### Cancelling a rollover delivery contract

If a producer decides not to offer the unaccepted tonnes in the next Series\*, the rollover delivery contract can be cancelled before the sign-up deadline for the next Series\*. Series contract decreases can be done through e-Services, by calling the CWB with their CWB 10-digit producer ID number and four-digit PIN.

### Contract buy-outs

Producers can contact the CWB to buy out tonnes from their delivery contract if they know they will not be able to deliver the accepted amount. If producers wish to buy out of their contract, contact the CWB. Buy-out rates are listed on our Web site under [Farmers>Farmer Contracts>Exiting a contract](#).

### Contract assignments

To reduce the tonnage committed to your delivery contract, you can assign (transfer) all or part of the tonnage to another producer by completing the [2011-12 CWB delivery contract assignment form](#), available on our Web site, and faxing it to the CWB at 1-204-983-8031. The assignment fee is \$25 per transaction and will be charged to the producer assigning tonnage (assignor). Your local elevator may be able to suggest another producer who is willing to take over your unwanted tonnes. Be sure to check the contract program details to ensure assignments are an option.
